High School Lacrosse Game to Support Ovarian Cancer Awareness

Student Molly McGaffigan of Bishop Guertin High School was diagnosed with ovarian cancer at the age of 15. Now, two years later, Molly has turned her own experience into a mission to spread awareness. Since her diagnosis, Molly had worked with Ovations for the Cure of Ovarian Cancer, a national ovarian cancer organization, to let women of all ages know the signs and symptoms of ovarian cancer. Her support of the organization and her dedication to spreading awareness earned her the Awareness Award at the organization's 2009 gala.

Through Molly's inspiration, her high school lacrosse team from Bishop Guertin has become active in supporting the cause, as well. Her team along with the lacrosse team from Londonderry High School has purchased teal and white uniforms to wear in their upcoming game at Stellos Stadium on May 27th, in Nashua, NH. This is the second annual lacrosse game in support of Ovations and ovarian cancer awareness.

"Ovarian cancer does not discriminate", says Lisa Collamore Tocci, Director of Operations for Ovations, "and it is admirable of these young women to come together to raise awareness of this insidious disease."
